19 November 2013 – On 13 and 15 November 2013, the Philippine Embassy in Beirut, Lebanon opened a condolence book for the victims of super typhoon Yolanda (international name: Haiyan), which struck central Philippines on 08 November 2013 and caused the death of thousands and left massive destruction to property.

Strong messages of sympathy and condolences for the bereaved families, as well as prayers for the speedy recovery of those who survived, were received in person and in writing from the members of the diplomatic and consular corps, the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL), officials from the Lebanese government, as well as Lebanese businessmen and individuals.
